




Transit of tea from DRC through Rusumo border

Components of the program

- Setting up a documentation plan (defining a documentation scenario and establishing a tentative list of procedures)
- Interviewing and collecting data: skills for data collection
- Registration of collected information in the business process analysis online tool.
- Analysis of data collected to identify duplication, redundancies and bottlenecks.
- Drafting of simplification proposals





UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON TRADE AND DEVELOPMENT POLICY BRIEF No. 98

MARCH 2022

- Women face gender-based barriers at borders that should be addressed through gender responsive trade
- UNCTAD recommends implementing the World Trade Organization (WTO) Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) with a gender perspective to maximize benefits for women involved in formal and informal trade
- . UNCTAD recommends that national trade facilitation committees (NTFCs) become gender-sensitive bodies that advocate for gender mainstreaming in trade facilitation reforms, and propose measures for women traders

Integrating a gender perspective into trade facilitation reforms'

Women cross-border traders face significant challenges, including time constraints, costs of burdensome procedures, discrimination and harassment at borders.1 Despite multilateral calls to address those issues and to make trade policies gender responsive,

The first step is to listen to what women traders have to say. Some may not be aware of the activities or existence of the national committee. Even when they know about NTFCs, they may feel that their committee is not aware of the challenges they face or that such challenges are simply ignored. NTFCs should undertake awareness-raising efforts to reach out to women traders by informing them about NTFC activities and consult them about their needs and the obstacles they face.

Women traders' associations should be invited to take part in the trade facilitation policymaking or















UNCTAD Trade facilitation program 2022:

- Activities in 40+ countries and with eight RECs
- Assisted 15 countries for WTO TFA notifications
- 1000+ stakeholders trained 50% women, 200+ online courses and webinars
- 95% of participants noted UNCTAD training helped them significantly
- UNCTAD Reform Tracker implemented in 20+ countries
- UNCTAD trade portals implemented in 30 countries.
- Work initiated on climate-smart trade facilitation
- Gender mainstreaming: Policy brief and e-learning on integrating gender perspective in TF
